Preamble :

The Erasmus Champ is a serious game designed for players to share and acquire the key knowledge of the Erasmus+ guide (2021-2027) and to strengthen links within a team.

It is made for staff in **higher education international relations offices** who work with the Erasmus+ programme.

This game was produced by the International Relations Office of the Université Polytechnique Hauts-de-France with the participation of the EUNICE alliance universities. It is funded by the Erasmus+ programme as part of the **Peer-IR-View** project.

Aim of the game :

The Erasmus Champ is a competitive trivia game. The first player to win all 12 stars, symbolising the European flag, wins the game.

Game prep :

Place the "**player aid**" cards on the table. These cards can be consulted by any player at any time during the game.


Remove the "**game rules**" cards.


Shuffle the cards and place them in the centre of the table.

Have a piece of paper and a pen ready to count the stars.

How to play :

1. The player takes the first card from the deck without looking at it.
2. The player (**the answerer**) gives the card to another player of his choice (**the asker**).

3a. If they draw a “*Mystery*”  card, **the asker** reads the card and applies the card’s effect.

3b. If they draw a “*Questions*”  card, **the asker** announces the category of the card (KA1, KA2, KA3, or General, Jean Monnet). **The asker chooses the question they want to ask.** Once the question has been asked, **the asker** asks **the answerer** what level of difficulty they would like to choose in order to answer, bearing in mind that:

- ★ = **DUO** (2 answer choices)
- ★★ = **QUATRO** (4 answer choices)
- ★★★ = **BINGO** (0 answer choices)

If the answer is correct, **the answerer** wins the number of stars corresponding to the level of difficulty. If the answer is wrong, no star is awarded.

4. Before the next turn, the card is discarded (unless otherwise indicated). The next player then draws a card.


Ending the game :

The first player to win all 12 stars symbolising the European flag ends the game and becomes ***The Erasmus Champ***.

Variants :

The Erasmus Champ can also be played in **teams** of 5 or 6 players. The rules remain unchanged. The members of each team must consult one another before answering the questions. The stars are counted by team.

The game is designed to be **modular**. The questions are categorised, so you can choose to play only with KA1, KA2 or general questions.

There are 9 types of ***"Mystery"***  cards, and there are 2 copies of each (18 cards in total). These cards are optional. You can play the game using only one card of each type, for example.

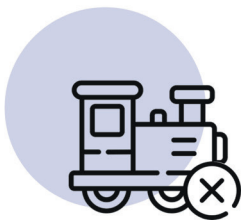
